"A to Z Mystery" series by Roy


"Geronimo Stilton" series by Stilton

3rd Grade Summer Reading Project "Story Quilt



Materials:

Pencils/markers

Glue

Construction paper

Scissors

Goal:

To share a book through a drawn quilt made up of scenes from a favorite story.

Steps to Complete Project:

- 1. Read the book.
- 2. Reread your favorite scenes.
- 3. Decide on how many squares to have in your story quilt.
- 4. List the scenes in order that you want to include.
- 5. Draw each scene onto the same size paper and include 1-3 sentences describing each event included in the guilt.
- 6. Be sure that you can retell the story so that it makes sense using your story quilt.
- 7. Use a construction paper border around the outside of the story quilt and between the quilt spaces.
- 8. Include the title, author and illustrator of the book on the story quilt.
- 9. Include your name on the back of the story quilt.

You will be graded on:

- How well the instructions of the project were followed.
- The neatness and creativity of the project.
- The retelling of the story during the presentation of the story quilt to the class.
