One way to do this is to write the words on note cards and practice going through them daily!

~ Writing Name:

Write first and last name using correct upper and lower case letters

Read a book with a grown up and talk about one of the characters (what they look like, role in story, etc.)	Go to church on Sunday with your family and friends to celebrate God.	Learn how to spell your last name and write it 10 different days.	Visit your local library and check out a book of your choice to read.	See if you can find all 26 letters in a magazine and cut them out and glue on a piece of paper.
Find something in your house for each of these shapes: a circle, rectangle, triangle, square and rhombus and talk about how many sides each item has.	When you take a walk, point out the directions you are going: turning left or right, going uphill or downhill. Point out which directions are north, south, east or west.	Talk about the weather to an adult: temperature, clouds, what you wear, what you see, etc.	Say your prayers everyday during the summer.	Read a book with a grown up and point out any color words you see in the text.
Write 20 of your sight words 5 times each.	Practice writing your lowercase letters. (at least 5 times)	Give your child a flyer, brochure or page from an old magazine. Circle a letter on the page and have him/her circle matching letters.	Write the alphabet 2 times using both upper and lower case letters.	Have an adult say words and student clap how many syllables they hear: (ex: cat=1 clap; family= 2 claps)
Have a grown up make a pattern out of cereal (or other item) and student will complete the pattern.	Go to www.starfall.com and play an alphabet game.	Practice counting how many spoons you have in your silverware drawer and adding the forks to the number.	Read a book with a grown up and pick out words that you already know.	Go on a walk with an adult. Draw or list all the things you saw on the walk.
When you are in the car point out the different things you see outside: trees, cars, people, buildings, etc.	Read a book with a grown up and pick any sight words you see.	"I Spy." Adult looks around and says, "I spy something that starts with the [m] sound. What is it?" Add clues such as "We use it to cut our grass." (mower) "It's where we put our letters." (mailbox)	Go to www.phonogrampage.com and practice the first 10 sounds.	Read a book for the <i>Border's Summer Reading Challenge</i> .

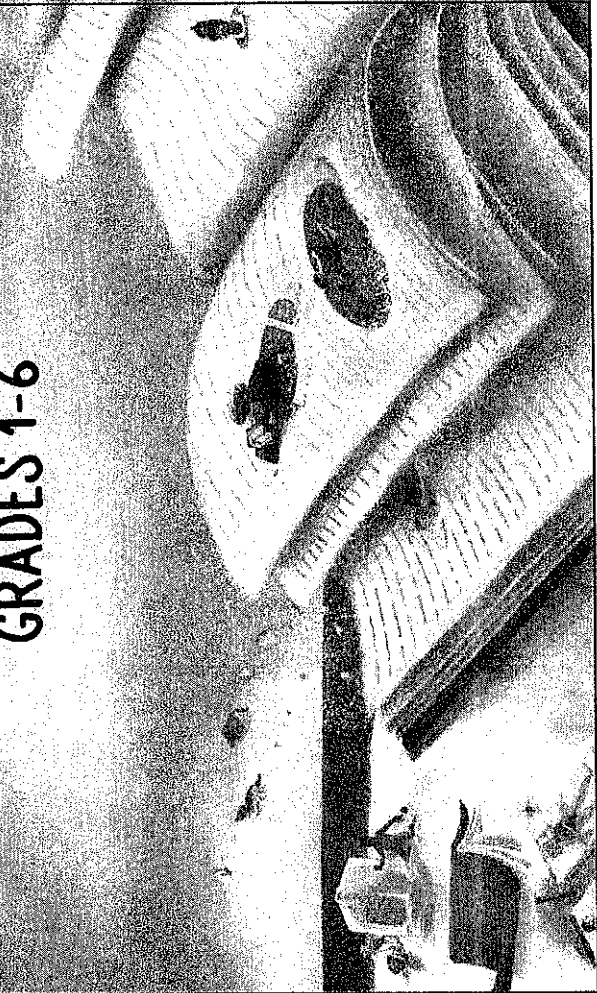
